Executive Director's Report

Where has the Summer gone? Labor Day is around the corner, and we are bombarded with backto-school sale ads. After a warmer than average July, August has been a bit cooler, but not without its share of storms. Although

not as violent as July's weather so far, some of these storms have produced significant damage and outages in localized areas. Electricity consumption and sales were up a bit in July. We will see what August brings when all is said and done.

For some time now, we have been discussing New York State's mandate that all new school bus purchases must be electric powered starting in 2027, and that all school bus fleets must be fully electric by 2035. Roughly 23 of our MEUA member



systems have school district bus facilities within your service areas. Many of you have already

been in discussions with local school officials to begin the planning process to accommodate the significant loads associated with electric bus charging facilities. Since in many cases significant capital improvements are needed to provide the additional electricity, if you haven't heard from your local school officials, I encourage you to reach out as soon as possible to begin those discussions. If you haven't already submitted an application to fund an engineering planning study under NYESERDA's PON 5737, this is an excellent opportunity to obtain funding for the development of a capital improvement plan that could benefit your system as well as your local school district. You should have recently received a registration reminder email from Ashleigh regarding the 2024 MEUA Annual Conference. The deadlines for hotel and conference registration are approaching quickly, so if you haven't already, please register as soon as you are able. We have packed a lot of information and opportunities for relaxed interaction with colleagues and vendors into a short time as you can see in the agenda set out in this newsletter. I hope you can make it.

There is not much new to report on the New York Power Authority's planned increase in the cost of our Niagara hydro power. We are continuing to ask questions and review additional information from NYPA and will keep you advised.

NYISO Update Chris Wentlent

New York Independent System Operator (NYISO) Releases Its Preliminary Reliability Needs (RNA) Presentation on July 25

On July 25, 2024, the NYISO presented its initial findings on a preliminary basis for its 10 Year (RNA).

Several important <u>highlights</u> of the presentation include:

- New York City transmission security margin baseline is identified beginning in 2031 driven by the assumed retirement of some natural gas facilities.
- A statewide deficiency resource deficiency is expected in the 2034 timeframe driven by increasing demand, large loads, and assumed natural gas availability.

The objective of the preliminary results is to offer an opportunity for market stakeholders to provide input before the final RNA is approved. Another stakeholder meeting is planned for the September timeframe, and the final report is expected to be voted on at the Operating Committee and Management Committee in October 2024. The NYISO Board of Directors must approve it and file it with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in November 2024.

Offshore Wind – NY

On July 17, 2024, Governor Hochul announced the state of construction of the Sunrise Offshore Wind Project. The project is a 924-megawatt project being developed by Orsted. It is to be completed in the calendar year 2026. The project cost is socialized across New York State based on a load ratio share formula.

Sunrise Wind has already completed all major federal and state permitting milestones and received approval of its Construction and Operations Plan (COP) from the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) on June 21, 2024.

Draft Fire Code Announced to Enhance Safety Standards for Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS)

On July 26, New York State announced updates to the New York Fire Code that contains draft code language to address recommendations from the Interagency Fire Safety Working Group. The draft code language includes updates and additions to improve coordination, safety and emergency preparedness in the planning of energy storage projects. As the battery energy storage system (BESS) industry evolves, the proposed recommendations will advance the safe and reliable growth of BESS capacity that is critical to the clean energy transition.

Proposed recommendations include:

- Requiring industry-funded independent peer reviews for all BESS installations exceeding energy capacity thresholds established for lithium-ion batteries;
- Requiring that qualified personnel or representatives with knowledge of the BESS installation are available for dispatch within 15 minutes and able to arrive on scene within four hours to provide support to local emergency responders in the event of a BESS fire.
- Extending safety signage requirements beyond the BESS unit itself to include perimeter fences or security barriers and include a map of the site, BESS enclosures, and associated equipment.
- Removing the Fire Code exemption for BESS projects owned or operated by electrical utilities to ensure that all projects comply with the Fire Code.
- Including a requirement that every BESS facility is equipped with an Emergency Response Plan (ERP) and requiring sitespecific training to be offered for local fire departments to familiarize them with the project, hazards associated with BESS, and procedures outlined in the ERP.
